

This time of searching for an interim pastor and then calling a pastor is a special time for reflection and prayer for our congregations. As communicated by the Southwest Minnesota Synod office, the process can take some time, and is an opportunity for our congregations to reassess our church's needs and ministry. It's a time to remember that we are a community of people who share one thing in common, to follow Jesus Christ our Lord.

Currently we do not have an interim pastor in place or in consideration. We currently have pulpit supply coverage for the immediate timeframe. The council will continue to try and fill with pulpit supply until an interim pastor can be considered. If you have an idea or would like to lead the congregation in worship, please contact one of the church council leaders.

In order to assess our future needs, we are asking for a call committee to be formed. Please contact the church council leaders and/or church office to volunteer. Initially, a ministry site profile will be considered and filled out for the congregations to help with the search process.

We continue to pray for Pastor Bev's health and recovery. As she stated in last month's newsletter, her recovery is expected to take several months. We will plan individual retirement celebrations with her and John for some time later this year. Once plans are finalized, announcements will be made to each congregation.

Times of transition are difficult. It's a time of prayer, lament, spiritual growth, fears, and hope. Through all the seasons, God journeys beside us. Through especially the difficult times, we give thanks that we have a Lord who knows suffering and has the power to resurrect us from all of our graves.

## **Honoring The Dead Of Unknown**

As Oliver Wendell Holmes, Jr. said in his Memorial Day address in 1884 at Keene, Memorial Day 'celebrates and solemnly reaffirms from year to year a national act of enthusiasm and faith.' With changing times, Memorial Day is more celebrated as a holiday than the glum occasion it was meant for. We must remember that the day means the honor of America's defense personnel who lost their lives in various wars. Though, people used to honor the graves of the war dead even before the Civil War, the National Memorial Day holiday, originally known as 'Decoration Day' was first observed on May 30, 1868.

The concept originated in the mind of General John Alexander Logan, who dedicated this day to decorate the graves of the American Civil War dead. Later, it encompassed all those who sacrificed their lives for their nation, from the Revolutionary War to the present. May 30<sup>th</sup> every year was celebrated as the Memorial Day until 1971. Later, the federal government issued the orders of holding the Memorial Day on the last Monday of May.

Seeing the Memorial Day losing its importance in the minds of younger generations, the concept of the National Moment of Remembrance was hatched by a national humanitarian organization known as the 'No Greater Love' based in Washington, D.C.It was introduced in 1997 and is recognized by the President and Members of Congress. Since then, 'Taps' is at 3 p.m. throughout America to honor the contributions of our dead soldiers. All Americans are encouraged to pay respect to them by keeping silent for one minute in their memory at 3:00 pm


